

## WEEKLY UPDATE

12/18/2020

Dear Residents and Families/Representatives,

Please accept this letter as our weekly update regarding the status of COVID-19 in our facility. Since the onset of this virus, we have had 47 residents and 41 staff members test positive for COVID-19. Our last positive test result for COVID 19 was on 12/14/2020. We are currently conducting twice weekly testing of employees and weekly testing of our residents.

As a Long-Term Care facility, we have partnered with Walgreens to administer COVID 19 vaccines to our residents and employees. Facility representatives will be contacting residents and/or their responsible parties regarding consent for the vaccination.

We continue to monitor our ability to offer outside visitation depending on what restrictions are currently applicable to our facility. We are currently unable to offer outside visitation at this time related to our recent positive case, however, we plan to reinstate outside visits as soon as allowed by guidelines. Until this is possible, we invite you to visit your loved one for a window visit or a virtual visit by telephone or tablet. All visits should be scheduled through our Activity Department, Jessica or Cindy at 864-227-9500.

As always, we are working hard to keep everyone in our community safe and we will continue to practice the enhanced safety precautions that are known to prevent the spread of COVID-19, such as only essential personnel are allowed inside the facility and we screen them for signs and symptoms of illness prior to entering. Our residents are continually monitored and staff is using PPE as recommended by the CDC. Staff is frequently reminded and encouraged to practice social distancing and to use hand sanitizer and frequently wash their hands when they are in the facility and out in the community. We ask them not to report to work if they have symptoms of illness.

Please continue to check our website for weekly updates as well as notification of new cases. As always, we will notify you if we receive confirmation of a new positive case in our facility and we will reach out to you individually if your loved one is displaying symptoms of COVID-19 or tests positive for COVID-19.

As Christmas approaches next week we thank you for your continued support through the pandemic.

As always, we are extremely grateful that you have entrusted your loved ones to our care and we are making every effort to provide our residents with wonderful holidays. We are currently unable to offer outside visitation at this time related to a 12/14/20 positive employee case, however, we plan to reinstate outside visits as soon as allowed by guidelines. Until this is possible, we invite you to visit your loved one for a window visit or a virtual visit by telephone or tablet. All visits should be scheduled through our Activity Department, Jessica or Coco at 864-227-9500.

As a reminder, our cumulative number of cases to date are as follows: 47 residents and 41 staff members have tested positive for COVID-19. Our regular weekly updates will resume next week and we will continue to update you on our website if we receive notifications of new confirmed cases of COVID-19. **December 31, 2020**

Dear Residents and Families/Representatives,

Please accept this letter as our weekly update regarding the status of COVID-19 in our facility. Since the onset of this virus, we have had 47 residents and 42 staff members test positive for COVID-19. Our last positive employee test result was on 12/28/2020.

We are currently able to offer only window visitation related to our recent positive result.

We hope you enjoyed our Holiday Update which was mailed to all responsible parties and distributed to in house residents as well.

Please be on the lookout for our 12/22/2020 letter mailed/distributed to each of you from Elite Patient Care. This letter outlines valuable and informative information regarding the COVID19 vaccine. We have partnered with Walgreens to administer vaccines to our residents and employees and are obtaining consents at this time. Our first onsite clinic has been scheduled for Friday, January 8, 2021. At this time, we have obtained 44 resident consents.

As always, we are working hard to keep everyone in our community safe and we will continue to practice the enhanced safety precautions that are known to prevent the spread of COVID-19, such as only essential personnel are allowed inside the facility and we screen them for signs and symptoms of illness prior to entering. Our residents are continually monitored and staff is using PPE as recommended by the CDC. Dear Residents and Families/Representatives,

Please accept this letter as our weekly update regarding the status of COVID-19 in our facility. Since the onset of this virus, we have had 47 residents and 40 staff members test positive for COVID-19.

We continue to test employees and residents in accordance with CDC guidelines which includes monitoring our weekly county positivity COVID 19 rate.

We continue to provide visitation in accordance with CDC guidelines based on new positive COVID 19 cases diagnosed in our resident and staff population. We are preparing to reinstate outdoor visitation with the provision of a heated tent, visitor screenings and visitation monitoring.
